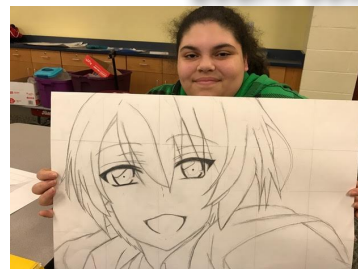

Dear Students,

★ Welcome to the Winter 2017 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC After-school Program Session!

The Winter Session begins on Monday, January 9th and ends on Friday, March 10th. Students will gather in the Villa Nova Cafeteria from 1:45 p.m. until 2:30 p.m. followed by after-school programs from 2:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. Upon entering the cafeteria, all students must check in with after-school program staff, get a snack, and wait for their program instructor. While in the cafeteria, students may do their homework or participate in educational activities and games.

★ After-school program dismissal is at 4:30 p.m. at the main entrance of Villa Nova. Parents/guardians must pick up their children **no later than 4:45 p.m.** If a parent/guardian will be arriving late or not able to pick up their child on a given day, please contact Ms. Costa by **4:00 p.m.** to inform the student of alternative transportation arrangements or give permission for the student to walk home. **For early dismissal**, students must provide a note from their parent/guardian to after-school program staff, or call Ms. Costa.

★ Listen to daily announcements in both buildings for program cancellations, and other after-school program news. IF A PROGRAM IS CANCELLED, STUDENTS MAY GO TO PROJECT LEARN FOR THE AFTERNOON.

★ An annual membership fee of \$15.00 per family is required to participate in the after-school program. There is also a \$5.00 activity fee per each student due at the beginning of the Fall, Winter and Spring 8-week sessions. Cash or check payable to: Connecting for Children and Families (CCF). Scholarships are available upon request. Contact Ms. Costa for more information.

★ Place your registration form and fee in an envelope with your name and homeroom/building on it. Return it to the main office at Hamlet or Villa Nova, or Ms. Costa in Room 2012 at Villa Nova no later than **Wed., Dec. 21, 2016.** Late registration forms are accepted if there is space available.
